Glendale Police Arrest Suspect in Triple Fatality Collision

GLENDALE, AZ. – Glendale Police arrest Carlos Daniel L Gonzalez for a fatal collision that killed three people. L Gonzalez is charged with three counts of 2nd Degree Murder. L Gonzalez self-surrendered today (12/29) and was booked into jail.

The two-vehicle fatal collision happened on August 25, 2021 at the intersection of 83rd Avenue and Bethany Home Road. The victims are identified as 18-year-old Ariyanna Alexis-Savina Parsad (the driver), 19-year-old Jazmine Esperanza Marquez and 18-year-old, Kiyvon Corlion Martin.

Parsad was traveling northbound on 83rd Ave through a green light at the intersection when L Gonzalez, who was driving a Tesla, was traveling westbound at a speed of 82 mph entered the intersection on a red light causing the collision. Marquez was pronounced deceased on the scene. Parsad and Martin were transported to a local hospital where they later died. L Gonzalez was transported to a local hospital with serious injuries. Lab results, which we recently received, showed L Gonzalez had tetrahydrocannabinol (THC) in his system at the time of the collision.
