Primary Property Tax Discussion

- Proposed as Restricted Funding Source for Presumptive Cancer Care for Public Safety
- 2% Increase is the Statutorily Allowable Increase
 - FY22 Increase \$121,769
- Legally Required Deadlines
 - Truth in Taxation Notices in May
 - Public Hearing June 8, 2021
 - Adoption of Property Tax Levy June 22, 2021

Sales Tax Discussion

- Food Tax (Food for Home Consumption)
 - 2.5% Tax Rate
 - 1.9% General Fund
 - 0.1% Public Safety
 - 0.5% Transportation
- Each 0.1% is approximately \$658,000 in revenue
 - Reduction of 0.1% equals \$1 per \$1,000 in food purchases
 - Food purchased with food stamps or EBT are exempt from the tax




Change to Budget since April 8th Workshop

- COLA increase for FY21-22 increased from 1.0% to 1.5% for Non-Represented Employees
- Position Reclassification Community Services Housing (Fund 6130)
 - Current Position: Supervisor, Building Maintenance
 - New Position: Supervisor, Facility Maintenance
 - No Budgetary Impact
- Appropriation for PSPRS Unfunded Liability
 - Non-Departmental (\$260M)
- CIP Carryover Updated




FY21-22 Total Budget Appropriation


FY21-22 Total Budget \$1.242B
