With the city's establishment of the percent—for—art ordinance in 1983, public art began to be commissioned and appear in various locations around the city. The arts program is designed to increase the public's awareness and appreciation of art. This list will serve the community by connecting artists with those looking to create enhancements or engage the public as part of their larger projects.

Artists included are pre-qualified for neighborhood art, private development, and municipal art opportunities. All artists represented in this publication were selected for inclusion through a committee review process. The Arts Commission recommends the featured artists because of their diversity in approaches, demonstrated professionalism, and innovative approach to artmaking. 
Noe Baez

Oliverio Balcells










Heidi Dauphin

Ariana Enriquez






Maria Madrid Reed




Laura Thurbon
